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

From our Executive Director:



Azleway Family Blessings

At this time of year, I am reminded just how richly blessed I am to share my life with those who give of themselves for His children. . .board members who wrangle with better ways to equip our program, staff who pour out their whole hearts, and those who share their blessings as foster and adoptive parents.

Recently, one of our boys turned 16. Facing the stark reality that the opportunity of having an adoptive family was remote, he knew that we at Azleway were the ones that he could count on to love and care for him. He asked me to take him out to eat for his birthday, which I gladly did. We had time to visit together, and relax at Golden Corral, where he could eat all he wanted.

As we got ready to leave, I left a tip for the waitress that had visited with us. He wanted to add to the tip and my first thought was to discourage him from using his meager allowance in that way. Then I thought, why would I rob him of the joy of sharing what he had.

One of our greatest challenges is how best to encourage others to join in our ministry to hurting children.

This is especially true when seeking additional staff, and foster or adoptive families willing to share their lives. One cannot promise that they will receive an immediate reward. Our children often have scars from abuse and neglect that prevent them immediately reciprocating the love and affection given to them.

Yet it seems that when I need encouragement the most, I hear of one of the children even decades later publicly sharing the impact we made on their lives. Or, I see a post of the joy they are receiving through their children or grandchildren. Or, I get to hear staff confide the struggles they are experiencing searching for the just the right advice to give one of our former kids.

Likewise, one cannot promise that the task of sharing one's life with these children will be easy. There is needed training to equip one to most effectively impact the children's lives. Also, there is the oversight of others seeking to make sure the homes we provide are safe and meeting the children's needs. But, one is not alone in this journey.

Our Azleway family will do everything possible to help encourage and equip. I was reminded of my minister's recent lesson about Jesus' call to his disciples to ministry in His kingdom. He did not say it would be easy or quickly rewarded. On the contrary, he said that they might not even have a place to lay their heads and might be asked to give their lives. Yet there is nothing greater than giving of one's self. Whether it is the gift of a birthday boy's allowance, giving to help hurting children, or sharing your home and life with one of His children.

Please prayerfully consider how you can give of yourself. For I guess that is what life is really about. To find out more about sharing your heart and home with a hurting child visit Azleway.org

Azleway Children's Services is a faith-based non-profit agency that has been faithfully restoring the lives and relationships of children in crisis since 1979. We have had the privilege of helping thousands of children and families in their times of desperate need.

Azleway started as a cottage with only 8 boys, and has grown across Texas to five locations, serving 500 boys and girls each year, aged 0 to 21 years. Azleway Children's Services Branch offices are in Tyler(Main Office), Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex/Grand Prairie, Houston/Humble, and Nacogdoches. At ACS, we offer Foster Care Services, Adoption Services, GRO, Valley View Residential, Substance Abuse Treatment (ASAP-Big Sandy), therapeutic homes, and Community Food Pantries. Community Food Pantries are located in Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex (Grand Prairie), Tyler, and Houston (Humble). In several of our locations, we offer a food pantry to our foster parents, adoptive parents, and community residents. Azleway also offers a clothing store to our foster and adoptive parents throughout the year, as well.

Once you and your family join our team, you will receive competitive reimbursement, counseling for the children and/or youth placed in your home, supportive staff members, and mentorship. Annual training to our foster parent(s), adoptive parent(s), and respite providers will be given.

While Azleway is a faith-based agency, it is not affiliated with any specific religious denominations. We are a very family-orientated organization which will nurture your success through love and support! Our agency takes pride in the support we have to offer our families and want to make this process as easy as possible.

Valley View

Azleway Valley Residential is intensive therapy set in relaxed atmosphere. Catering to at-risk boys, Azleway Valley View Residential

provides a variety of professional services tailored to meet the needs of residents in a planned continuum of care.

Providing flexible, individualized therapy, testing and counseling services, Azleway staff professionals are committed to building a program to fit each child's needs. Each boy is invited into a caring environment at Azleway Valley View Residential, where they receive structure, compassion, education and coping skills.

Azleway Substance Abuse Program

Founded in 1997, the **Azleway Substance Abuse Program (ASAP)** helps kids get free from chemical dependency. The staff, of licensed professional counselors and licensed chemical dependency counselors, works with young men ages 13-17, in a ranch setting in **Big Sandy, Texas.**

Azleway's ASAP program is the most intensive level of care, short of DETOX. We provide Substance Usage Disorder, individual, group and family counseling, as well as individual and group mental health therapy, when indicated.

The goal is to help each youth develop a solid recovery program that includes relapse prevention planning and strong support systems, through group and individual counseling, education and group therapy.

"God bless us, every one."





Ready to Learn More?

How long does it take to become a foster parent with Azleway?

Typically it takes about three months to go through the verification process. The timeframe is heavily dependent on your ability to provide all required documentation, the completion of in-home interviews with family members, and the completion of all required training. Once these requirements are met, one of our Development Coordinators will complete a home-study. If the home-study and verification process is approved, your home will become a verified foster home with Azleway. Once verified, one of our Intake Coordinators will begin looking for placements for your new foster home.

What if I feel like I'm just not ready to be a foster parent - are there other ways that I can help?

Yes, there are other ways that you can help foster children and foster families. You can donate your time. You could also be a respite provider, or babysitter to help foster parents have some downtime, or take some time to themselves. You can make a monetary donation. You can promote our agency on social media, by following our Facebook pages, and sharing with your friends and family. You can tell your friends, your church groups, your co-workers, mom or dad groups about Azleway, and ask them to follow our Facebook pages, or even visit our website. Every contribution, small or large, helps us get the word out about what we do and how others can get involved.

What if I just have a question about becoming a foster parent or how I can help?

The best way to find information about Azleway is to visit our website at azleway.org. Our website provides information on how to become a foster parent, and a place to ask questions about fostering or foster care in general. You can also find ways on how you can help Azleway in meeting our goals, and how to make a monetary donation to Azleway.

Please do not ask to give your gifts to the child in person. Azleway strives to make Christmas as home-like as possible and observes traditional times for giving the gifts to the children Christmas Eve or Christmas morning.

All items need to be unwrapped and labeled with the child's name.

Stockings are great gifts, as are any other extras you may like to provide. If you don't want to choose an individual child, items such as stocking stuffers, board games, bibles, sports balls, watches, wallets, cologne, batteries, small toys, etc., are always needed. Azleway has been faithfully restoring lives and relationships of children in crisis since 1979. We have had the privilege of helping thousands of children and families in their times of desperation.

Every child that comes into our agency is evaluated and placed in an appropriate program based on his or her needs. We have a continuum of care which includes: basic foster family homes, therapeutic foster family homes, and general residential operation (GRO).



GENERAL RESIDENTIAL OPERATION (GRO)

Children struggling with emotional and behavioral issues are quickly stabilized in Azleway's Residential Treatment program. Unfortunately, many of these youths are not ready to move into foster care.

Bouncing between residential treatment and foster care is hard for a child's security, education and self-esteem. Azleway's GRO program is a way to transition a child into foster care by continuing enrollment in an on-campus school, where the child receives counseling services, structured activities, case-management support and care from professional staff who can maintain active support. A change in placement can then be accomplished when the child is ready and able to successfully function in a less-restrictive environment.

VALLEY VIEW RESIDENTIAL

Valley View Residential is intensive therapy set in a relaxing atmosphere. Catering to at-risk boys, Valley View provides a wide variety of professional services, tailored to meet the needs of residents, in a planned continuum of care. Providing flexible, individualized therapy, testing and counseling services, Azleway staff professionals are committed to building a program to fit each child's needs. Each boy is invited into a caring environment at Valley View, where he receives structure, compassion, education and coping skills.

FOSTER CARE SERVICES

Azleway Children's Services (ACS) was originally established to provide the "next step" for successful residents of Valley View Residential. Now, Azleway finds homes for boys and girls, ages 0-17. When parents are unable or unwilling to care for a child, ACS finds safe, secure homes for these Texas children in crisis through our Foster Care Program. Foster homes range from basic care homes to therapeutic homes, depending on the needs of the child.

AZLEWAY SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM (ASAP)

Founded in 1997, the Azleway Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) helps kids get free from chemical dependency. The staff, of licensed professional counselors and licensed chemical dependency counselors, works with young men ages 13-17, in a ranch setting in Big Sandy, Texas. The goal is to help each youth develop a solid recovery program that includes relapse prevention planning and strong support systems, through group and individual counseling sessions, education and group therapy.

ADOPTION SERVICES

Azleway Children's Services (ACS) also provides adoption services. At Azleway, parents can be verified to adopt in two ways, matched adoptions or foster-to-adopt. Potential adoptive parents must be at least 21 years of age, with a high school diploma or GED, and must pass a criminal and child abuse background check. Since its inception, the Azleway Adoption Program has helped over 150 children find their forever homes.

Also, adopting a child through **Azleway and the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (TDFPS)** is far less expensive than private adoptions. We will help guide prospective families through the adoption process, including assistance with the required home study and paperwork and working with TDFPS.

Potential adoptive parents must be at least 25 years of age, with a high school diploma or GED, and pass a criminal and child abuse background check. In addition, they must complete pre-service training with a focus on children who have been abused or neglected, become certified in first aid and CPR, and complete a comprehensive home study.


